## The Odderbots Robotics Team A story straight out of the movies!

What do you get when you take the kids from *Stranger Things* and *The Goonies*, twist them around to be four girls and one boy and put them in a quest to be the next Vex IQ World Robotic champions? You get the highly unique 'Odderbots' Robotics team from the quiet little town of Feilding.

Five kids who wear their badge of being a bit 'odder' than the other kids proudly. Unique and bubbly by nature, tightly supportive of each-other despite their differences, these kids with their quirky and delightful senses of humour will be doing what no-one thought was possible... taking on the World at the VEX IQ World Championship in Louisville, Kentucky in April 2019.

Creative, innovative and tons of fun, these kids know everyone in a team is important and everyone can make a difference. To see how they interact and support each-other is heartening – to learn what they have achieved is downright inspiring.

With outstanding support from their teachers and mentors at Manchester Street School, the Odderbots dream came true on the 8<sup>th</sup> of December when they took out the top Excellence Award at the NZ Vex IQ National championships in the Elementary division... cue the hysteria, hugs, tears and on-stage penguin dancing... "we're going to America!!!!"

At the Vex IQ World Championships, the Odderbots will be up against some stiff competition - including competitors whose robots have been designed and built by their countries top Universities.

Unlike these teams however, the Odderbots have designed, built and programmed their robot by themselves from the ground up, demonstrating good old 'number 8 wire' kiwi ingenuity in their approach. To date, their robot has been through several rebuilds and multiple modifications... but they know the value of perseverance and they're not finished yet!

While other kids have been out enjoying the sun over the holidays, these kids have been buckling down to improve their skills. A team 'den' has been set up for them to hide out in and practice, practice, practice for the coming event.

Fundraising events are also occurring, with the team needing to raise around \$35,000 to get the full crew there. No mean feat, but these kids are determined and in between practices they have been working hard to do their part: selling raffles, handing out tote bags, sizzling sausages, and undertaking work for people in the local community.

# Message from the Mayor

The draft results of our Town Centre Visioning consultation exercise have been presented to Council and are now being worked into a draft vision public document. Feedback shows that most people value some of our heritage buildings, with a few iconic heritage buildings specifically being named as ones our community has an interest in seeing retained and strengthened.

Lots of your comments relate to how we get around, parking and potential future uses of the town centre, including accommodation in upper floors of buildings. Another constant theme was the desire to see more events and social activity happening in Manchester Square. All this information will give the vital confidence needed to our building owners, developers and investors that our town centre is worth investing in, to make it more vibrant and attractive, not only for business but as a key part of our community's wellbeing.

The Earthquake Prone Building (EQPB) process continues with Council required to consult with our community on whether we should have Priority Thoroughfares or not. No specific criteria is given as to what is a priority thoroughfare, other than identifying our busiest footpaths and streets where EQPB's are located, that could pose a risk to life and public safety.

While public safety is high priority, the implications of approving any Priority Thoroughfares comes with significant impact on our EQPB owners. As Manawatu sits in a high EQ risk zone our EQPB owners currently have 15 years to strengthen or demolish their buildings. Those buildings that would sit within an approved Priority Thoroughfare have that timeframe reduced to just 7.5 years in respect of those parts of buildings that could fall into public areas.

The dilemma for our community is to decide what level of risk we are prepared to take, versus the impact on our town centre, building owners, businesses, employees and customers.

The good news is that our joint effort with Whanganui, Rangitikei and Tararua Councils, lobbying central government to attempt to get them to understand the severe implications of the new legislation on provincial NZ, is being heard and acted on. There has been Government announcements offering financial support to assist owners of heritage buildings, some proposed changes to the Building Code Alterations regulations and some positive work started with Engineering NZ.


Council is asking for your written feedback on the proposed priority thoroughfares before 4pm on Monday 11 March, 2019. ## Kimbolton Sculpture Festival returns 6<sup>th</sup> April

Are you looking for a unique sculpture for your garden, something that reflects your connection to the land, maybe some craft piece that takes your eye, or just a day out with the family where you can view amazing sculptures, lose your children in a wool dive, pony ride, creative activity or a vintage car ride?

The Kimbolton Sculpture Festival on Saturday the 6<sup>th</sup> April is the place to be.

Make a day of it! Enjoy a leisurely drive out to Kimbolton Village, take in the sights and experience art in the country. The Festival includes outstanding rural sculptures, textile art exhibitions, quilters and crafters, live music, arts and craft stalls, country food, vote for the people's choice sculpture award, demonstrations of blacksmithing, art creation and woodworking, children's interactive events, and lots of other family friendly entertainment.

The big prize money on offer at last year's festival saw the number eight wire mentality come out in force in the 100 entries from Timaru in the South to Kaeo in the North and everywhere in between. Onlookers among the 3000 people who attended were astounded by the quality of the sculptures that were made from items found in farm sheds.

Sculptures are judged on their connection to the land and are made from material such as recycled machinery, steel, wire, wood etc and can be as large as a life-sized horse made from bicycle tyres to a hedgehog made from shearing cutters.

Entry to the festival is \$5 per adult with children under 18 free. Gates open 9:00am through to 4:00pm. Eftpos is available.

There are seven in particular that we want your views about now and seven we will consult on later. Here are the seven we want your views about:

- Animal Bylaw 2014 Explanatory Bylaw 2014
- Dog Control Bylaw 2014 Cemeteries Bylaw 2014
- Public Facilities (Swimming Pools and Library) Bylaw 2014 Drainage Bylaw 2015
- Public Places Bylaw 2015 Freedom Camping Bylaw 2014
- Street Users Bylaw 2014 Objectionable Signs Bylaw 2014
- Traffic Safety and Road Use Bylaw 2015

This pre-consultation is open 20 Feb – 20 Mar 2019. ## Introducing Sergeant Dave Fraser, Feilding Police Station

Sergeant Fraser has been with Feilding Police since November 2018 as Officer in Charge.

The previous Sergeant, Sgt Scott Banner, left the police mid-2018, during which there was a temporary appointment made to the position for a few months. David is now here full time and expects to remain with the Feilding Police for several years.

Sgt Fraser brings with him 32-years of knowledge in the police force, working in areas including Whanganui, Marton, Chatham Islands, East Timor and Foxton. His experience as a small-town Constable includes 12 years as a Constable in Bulls, as a Sgt at Feilding and running the Police Station in Foxton.

Dave says, *"I have always worked in small rural towns. I get a great deal of satisfaction from helping people and a community that I know and live in, and being able to see the positive difference you can make in a small community."*

*"Feilding seems to have got a busier and grown over the last two years since I worked here,"* he notes. *"There seems to be more cars, people and new housing. This is a great thing, people love Feilding and are proud of their community."*

Sgt Fraser's role includes overseeing the Community Team, Youth Services and Traffic teams along with directing how the frontline Constables work in the Feilding area.

The Feilding team is responsible keeping everyone safe and happy from Rangiwahia in the north to Himatangi in the south and between the Rangitikei River to Palmerston North. It's a large area with many small communities. Since his appointment in November, Sgt Fraser has spent his time learning how the station, staff and community work.

*"Everybody I talk to tells me how good the relationship between our local police and our community is. There is a great community spirit in town and numerous community groups all looking to make our towns and communities everyone safe and happy. I look forward to working with you all."*



## Plenty of police presence in Feilding

Sgt Fraser has noted there is a misconception in the Feilding Community that many people believe there are no police in Feilding; this is far from accurate. While there were some changes a few years ago as to how the Feilding police operated, there is a strong police presence in the area.

There are 8 police based at the Feilding Station each day. A new Community Constable has recently been appointed and Sgt Fraser hopes that another Community Constable will be appointed here in the next month.

In addition, the station is staffed 24/7 by a Police Safety Team. These are uniformed Constables with full frontline experience and equipment. If they need assistance attend all calls for service, then this is only a few minutes away and is provided by the Community team, Palmerston North, Bulls or Kimbolton.




